66TH ANNUAL RALLYE GLENWOOD SPRINGS, JUNE 8-10, 2018

The MG Car Club - Rocky Mountain Centre invites you to join us for the 66th Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs, the oldest continually-held time-speed-distance rally in the United States, on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, June 8, 9, 10, 2018.

The weekend is a marvelous opportunity, not just for MG owners, but for sports car enthusiasts of every marque (British, American, German, Italian, Japanese) to come together for sunny days, cool nights, and unique events. The fun begins on Friday with the Tour to Glenwood Springs, which will take you through some beautiful scenery on the way to Glenwood Springs. Saturday's main event is the more rigorous time-speed-distance rallye to challenge both novice and experienced rallyists, starting and finishing in Glenwood Springs, rallying through canyons and over mountain passes in the heart of the Rocky Mountains.

Again, this year is a youth tour so that your kids will have their own tie-breaker questions to answer. Spend the day winding through the beautiful mountain valleys around Glenwood Springs. The weekend culminates with a social gathering Saturday night and the Car Show, Funkhana, and Awards Presentation on Sunday.

Since its inception, the MGCC-RMC has sponsored the Rallye, which began when a hardy group of sports car owners discovered the joys of motoring in Colorado in MGs that still had drop-down tops and running boards. The Rocky Mountains of central Colorado, with some of the most breathtaking scenery in America, formed the backdrop for the Rallye Glenwood Springs through 65 previous years. Vintage and classic cars from as far away as California and Illinois have shared the twisting mountain roads with their newer counterparts for octane-related festivities. Enthusiasts have come from as far away as England to drive their sports cars through such fabled Colorado mining towns as Leadville and Aspen on their way to Glenwood Springs.

THE FRIDAY TOUR

The Friday Tour may be started at your leisure; however, we recommend you depart no later than 9:00 a.m. Tour instructions will be given out between 7:30 – 9:00 a.m. in the parking lot of Gunther Toody's.

For those driving or transporting T-series cars, a special lower speed, unscored tour is available that takes you over roads with more leisurely speed limits.

The tour this year will begin in Littleton and end in Glenwood Springs. There will be three tour classes: MG Class, Vintage Class and Modern Class. Three awards are given for each class.

This year's tour is written from the perspective of a dog; specifically, a goofy, attitudinal, and somewhat psychotic Husky/Yellow Lab mix named Diesel. You will be required to provide photographic evidence of certain places along the route. Bring a camera. Accepted evidence will be a digital photo (shown when you turn in your package), a polaroid that you can keep or an artist's rendering. A few answers will be found by parking your car and taking a short walk along Main St. in Breckenridge. You will also be required to do some math, as all dogs enjoy a good math problem. Bring a calculator. The Tie Breaker questions will be dog related and about things you learned in school.

THE SATURDAY RALLYE

**SATURDAY, First Car Departs at 8:01 a.m.
Two Rivers Park, Glenwood Springs**

This year's Rallye will be a traditional Time Speed Distance (TSD) Rallye. The rallyemasters have avoided hard-to-see signs and other annoyances to ensure a fun and challenging rallye experience.

A clipboard, pen/pencil and paper, stop watches and a well-read copy of the Rallye General Instructions will be helpful. Please visit the MGCC.org website to read the Rallye General Instructions and the Rallye Primer. An experienced rallyist will be available at the start location to answer questions.

The route is anticipated to stay on paved roads, although some well-maintained unpaved roads may be encountered. All assigned speeds will be at or below posted speed limits. There will be breaks along the route, including a lunch break.

Rallye Classes

Novice SOP (Seat of the Pants) – Rallyists are eligible for Novice Class until they win a First Place, or have competed in THREE TSD Rallyes. Pencil and paper calculations only.

Intermediate SOP – Rallyists are eligible for Intermediate Class until they have won First Place twice in Intermediate Class. Pencil and paper calculations only.

Experienced SOP - No limit on experience. Pencil and paper calculations only. Rallye Charts and Tables are permitted.

Vintage – Any equipment must be period correct. Cars must be forty years old or older (1977 or older).

Computer – No limit on equipment.

Participants are expected to properly determine their Rallye Class, and enter it on their scorecard. Failure to indicate your class on the scorecard will place you in Experienced SOP Class.

Trophies will be awarded in First - Fourth places in Novice and Intermediate Classes, and First - Third Places in Experienced, Vintage, and Computer Classes.

THIS YEAR'S FEATURED MG

THE MG TC

We are celebrating the MG TC as the featured car of our 66th Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs. GI's returning from Europe after World War II brought home MG TC's and it became The Sports Car America Loved First. Our MG Car Club was founded based on the excitement generated from MG drivers meeting other MG owners. Early pictures of the Denver Sports Car Club and the MG Car Club, Rocky Mountain Centre show MG TC's and TD's lined up with Jaguar XK-120s at Red Rocks.

Pre-World War II MG Midget styling and design elements were continued in the TC including 19" wheels, folding windshield, and the XPAG, 1250cc, 4-cylinder, OHV pushrod engine. Design evolution from the 1939 TB include changing the semi elliptic springs from sliding trunnion to shackle couplings, converting the clutch from oil sump to dry plate, widening the cockpit by 4 inches, narrowing the running boards and wings (fenders) to keep the same car dimensions, lengthening the doors for easier access, and installing a transmission synchronized in 2nd to 4th gear.

10,001 MG TC's were produced from September 1945 (chassis number TC0251) to November 1949 (chassis number TC10251) with 3,408 sold in Britain, 2,001 coming to the USA, and 4,592 to the rest of the world. TC's were available in Black, Regency Red, Shires Green, Sequoia Cream, and Clipper Blue cellulose paint with leather seating in Vellum Beige, Shires Green, or Regency Red. Radiator grille slats were color-matched to the upholstery.
