

Where: Glenwood Springs

Why: The Glenwood committee changed the dates from early June to late August, hoping to leverage the COVID vaccination rate and enjoy possible loosened restrictions on social gatherings.

here is good reason to be optimistic. The COVID vaccination rate is improving every week. New vaccines are being approved by the FDA. The vaccine supply is increasing. President Biden promises that all adults who want a vaccination will be able to get one by the end of July. The risk, experts claim, will be significantly reduced for those people with vaccinations who choose to attend group functions.

So, currently, the Glenwood committee requests (but not requires) that "only those vaccinated against COVID-19, showing no signs of infection, participate and that entrants wear masks and practice social distancing commensurate with guidelines in place at the time of the event." It's all about keeping our senior club members safe.

The picture may change radically in the coming months. On the one hand, we have the real possibility of achieving herd immunity in time, depending on the vaccination rate. On the other, there's the potential for future surges or the spread of more virulent variants of the virus. Either scenario can lead to changes in CDC guidelines (and local restrictions) regarding group gatherings.

Given how fluid the situation remains, a few other tough decisions had to be made.

The first is to put Saturday's Gearshift Social on hold. We may nor may not be able to have the event based on current CDC guidance, state and local health department orders, host hotel policy, etc.

Since the social is the only indoor event scheduled as part of the Rallye weekend, we should be good to go for the other events, while practicing social distancing, mask wearing, etc., whatever is in effect in August.

Second, the Glenwood Committee carefully chose this year's dates based on hotel availability and potential conflicts with other events, including the Conclave and the Oil Spot Rallye. The committee promises a return to our traditional June dates in 2022.

And Finally, since no one knows what restrictions will remain in place, including the allowable size of gatherings, mask mandates, etc., the Glenwood Committee plans on making adjustments as necessary. By pushing the event out to August, the chances of us having a near-normal event improve every day.

That's why the 2021 logo features the "shadow" of 2020. The specter of COVID continues to affect the things we can and cannot do. Marines, we'll improvise, adapt and overcome.

After a difficult year with the COVID-19 pandemic, the MG Car Club Rocky Mountain Centre is pleased to continue the tradition of hosting a marvelous weekend where MG owners and sports car enthusiasts of every marque (British, American, German, Italian, Japanese, and electric) come together to enjoy sunny days, cool nights, and unique events in Glenwood Springs. We invite you to join us for the 69th Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs, the oldest, continually-held, time-speed-distance rally in the United States, on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, August 27, 28, and 29th.

The fun begins on Friday with the Tour which departs from Gunther Toody's Restaurant in Littleton, CO and finishes in Glenwood Springs. This year's tour can best be described as the intersection of Top Gear and The Great British Baking Show. Along the route, participants will demonstrate carefully honed skills required of vintage car owners and will complete a unique scored technical challenge at the host hotel afterwards.

Saturday's main event is the more rigorous time-speed-distance rallye designed to challenge both novice and experienced rallyists. The rallye departs from the host hotel in Glenwood Springs, runs through canyons

and over scenic roads in the heart of the Rocky Mountains, and finishes back at the hotel in Glenwood Springs.

On Saturday evening we usually host the Gearshift Social at the Glenwood Springs Courtyard Marriott Hotel. At this time we are not planning any indoor events due to CDC guidelines. However, if those guidelines change we will add the Gearshift Social back to the agenda.

The weekend's activities round out with the Car Show, Funkhana, and Awards presentation at Two Rivers Park on Sunday.

Alan Saltzman


"Guess where I am?" Alan asked me over the phone. "In the hospital. With COVID." This was the weekend before Thanksgiving. When I recovered enough to ask for more detail, I learned that Alan had been downgraded from a stay in ICU and was now in a special COVID hospital room.

Alan went on to say that he was feeling pretty good, that he was arguing with his doctors about his medications (he was not afraid to do so), and was eager to get home.

He sounded tired. Wheezy and tired, but his old cheerful self. We shared some hospital humor: "Can you get up and move around?" "Yes." "Get up and lock the door. Don't let them back in."

Alan's wife Lita, recovering from COVID herself, somehow managed to send us regular email updates based on her daily calls with the doctors. Her emails described a series of minor improvements and more serious setbacks as Alan battled for his life.

As word spread, friends offered prayers, and sent positive thoughts and energy. Veletia Manning burned dried cedar for her ailing friend, in a Native American ceremony called smudging. Cedar is especially associated with protection against disease and with healing of the spirit. Joe Haynes, a descendant of the Caddo Nation of the Southern Plains,



delivered cedar necklaces for Lita and daughter Justine to wear.

On December 17th, Lita managed to send a heartbreaking email (below). Alan had passed away. He was 71.

Hello Everyone,

It is with a heavy heart that we are writing to you tonight, to inform you of Alan's passing. He had been fighting battles on multiple fronts, and we believe that the amount of stress his body was under simply became too much for even someone as strong-willed as Alan to overcome.

This past month had indeed been a difficult journey for Alan, and equally heartbreaking for those that were lucky enough to have known him. Those of you that have followed our updates will know that this journey has been one with myriad twists and turns that often raised more questions than were ever answered.

Despite the difficulty of the challenges he faced, he managed to persevere further than any of the doctors treating him ever expected, pushing the envelope in typical Alan fashion.

As you all know, Alan lived his life, not in fear of the unknown, but rather with a sense of excitement, wonderment, and adventure. A gift he was happy to share with everyone he met, and one that was always precious to us. Alan fought as hard as he could to his last breath, with the reckless abandon of a true adventurer. We were fortunate enough to be able to send Alan off, surrounded by his family that he loved dearly. And we hope that he was able to embark on this new journey knowing that he was loved more than words can express.

While his sudden departure is a shock to us all, we'd like you all to think of Alan tonight, and remember a time when he made you smile. We know he'll be smiling with you.

My wife, Irene, and I had the honor of participating in an online Shiva service attended by approximately 200 people, hosted by Lita, Justine and Ethan. Other club members who attended included Al and Patty Wulf, John and Ritsuko Fraioli, Joe Haynes, Stan and Eileen Edwards, Dick and Judy Fritz, John and Rebbecca MacIntyre, Jack and Cathy Knopinski, and Glen and Bobbi Mapes. (My apologies if I missed you. There were a lot of people online.)

Friends and family spoke of Alan's generosity and his genuine interest in other people. It turns out that Alan had spoken with many people from his hospital bed before he went back into ICU. He asked everyone, "How ya doing?" During the service, Alan was lauded by his family and friends as likely the only Jewish man in America who "knew how to change a tire, cut wood and make a fire." There were many Alan stories, including one I witnessed firsthand: On a recent M.O.A.B. trip, we found ourselves outside of Dinosaur. There's a straight stretch of road there that's lightly traveled and offers full visibility for several miles. Alan ran his beloved Honda S2000 up to 140 mph. I remember him passing us, with a look of absolute joy on his face.

The afterlife can mean very different things to each of us. In general, I believe it to be where you are surrounded by love. Since Alan lived so well, he achieved that here on earth. God Bless and Keep You, my friend. And may the roads you travel always be wide open.

s I write this article, MG International Atlantic City 2021 is a little over three months away. These events are always fun to plan and even more to attend, but to say the planning of the event this year has been a challenge would be an understatement.

While Covid-19 remains a concern, we are confident that our event will be safe and enjoyable. We have been working diligently with the staff of Harrah's and Caesar's on all aspects of our gathering.

We receive regular updates from the State of New Jersey on changes in State restrictions/ mandates. Additionally, Harrah's is also in continual communication with us with suggestions and approvals on how we would like to conduct our meetings and banquets. (By the way, you will still have a selection of entrees and side dishes at the Tuesday and Thursday night banquets, but these items will be served to you by hotel staff.) Rest assured that we are making all efforts to be in compliance with requests by the City and State as well as by the hotel properties.

As you enter the properties, your temperature is taken and you are asked to review Covid guidelines which are posted at the entrances. Separate doors are used for entry and exit from the hotel as well as its meeting rooms.

We are fortunate in that we have plenty of room available for our tech sessions and banquets; social distancing should not be a

concern. On the plus side, you will not have to worry about the back of your chair at the banquet table hitting the chair of the registrant behind you when you get up!

Council members Richard Liddick and Tony Burgess joined me for site visits to Atlantic City and the surrounding area in April and October of 2020. We were pleased with how the staff and the patrons of all venues conducted themselves. There was no crowding at restaurants, no packing of elevators, the patrons in casinos and bars were not packed shoulder-to-shoulder. Hotel check-in was smooth and trouble-free. The entire Council will be making a final site visit this April; I expect to be equally pleased with this visit as well.

Enough Covid talk. Let's talk about the event!

Online registration at https:// ac2021.regfox.com/mg-international-2021 will remain available through June 1, 2021 but "early bird discounts" will expire on May 1, 2021. (You can, of course, order your regalia directly through our vendor by visiting our "online store" at https://mgint.itemorder.com/sale and have meet regalia mailed to you in advance of your arrival in Atlantic City or just to have, even though you may not be able to make it to Atlantic City.) We have plenty of guest rooms available at Harrah's, but you must register for the event before you can reserve a room at our preferred rate.

You will NOT want to miss the tour of the Simeone Foundation Automotive Museum; the tours to Cape May and Smithville are also enjoyable, especially for those with interests outside of the smell of old leather interiors, the sound of noisy tappets, or the aroma of burning Castrol. There's even a winery tour available! (And you won't be asked to "stomp grapes"!)

We have a great roundup of presenters for our in-house tech sessions at Harrah's. Our Register Night at Caesars will be a fun night. We will be celebrating the life of our friend Hank Rippert on Wednesday evening at Harrah's with an informal wake/party. The Rippert Family will be present as well as many friends of Hank's from his many interests over the decades. We invite you to come celebrate with us with a toast of Gentleman Jack (or your favourite potable) to Hank that evening.

And of course our popular vote car show, held outdoors at the 4H County Fairgrounds in nearby Egg Harbour, on Thursday will be followed by our Awards Banquet at Harrah's that evening.

MG International Atlantic City 2021 will be a great event, even though somewhat smaller than our previous gatherings. We encourage you to get your vaccines when possible, bring your masks, and get your MG up and ready for your road trip to our gathering of "MGs by the Sea!"

We are experiencing an unusual mild spell of weather as I write this at the end of February and my TF 160 (modern) with its Hardtop on, has had its first outing since the 90th Anniversary celebration at Gaydon last October. It is tempting to take the BGT out of its bubble in the garage, but we know deep down it is too early and that Jack Frost is not done with us yet!! 

Drive.com reports that "MG is set to make the biggest change to its iconic badge since the company was founded almost a century ago."

According to the Australian website, the brand is testing a new identity on the stunning E-Motion electric sports car concept revealed at the Shanghai motor show, replacing its traditional hexagonal logo with a more stylised round badge as part of a softer, European-inspired new design language that will eventually make its way across MGs existing range of hatchbacks and SUVs.





Shao Jingfeng: just keeping up with the times?

Shao Jingfeng, the chief designer for MG's parent company Shanghai Automotive Industrial Corporation (SAIC), told Drive at a preview of the E-Motion that he is expecting some backlash from traditional owners but said the change was necessary to integrate the badge into the more organic style.

"I make a little test with this car," he said.

"It is so difficult to use this [old badge] into our design, because **it looks like a big nose**. It is too pointy. It has too many angles that it doesn't fit with this new style. "I don't want our cars to look angry with this badge, I want to make it look more like a friend."

It is the first (major) alteration to the famed Morris Garages (MG) badge for over 90 years.




